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- Although histologic differences between congenital and acquired nevi are frequent, insufficient data are available to precisely evaluate the predictive value of microscopic criteria that might be used to differentiate congenital and acquired nevi.

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- Congenital pigmented nevi less than 10 cm in diameter may be associated with a higher risk of development of melanomas. These melanomas are usually epidermal in origin, of the superficial spreading type, and do not become manifest before puberty.
